- Den Trees Reserve trees with obvious den and cavity usage, even if not marked to leave.
- · Leave Trees: Burr oak and 2/3 of red pine stand.

Landings, Access Roads, and Skid Trails

- · Landings Approved Landing locations must be approved in advance by the Forester. Sale plan includes 3 or 4 landings
- Roads stay open Sale is mostly accessible via existing road system. Roads to remain open and in pre-existing or better condition with BMP drainage after use. Any temporary trail or spur will be closed.

- Pine thinning guides to minimize Ips Bark Beetle Damage in residual or nearby pine. A) December 1–May 31: All cut pine material > 3" and pine logs must be removed or destroyed before June 1; B) June 1–August 31: All cut pine material > 3" and pine logs must be or destroyed within 3 weeks of cutting; C) September 1–November 30: may leave slash on site

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
